She is also a member of ITMO neurosciences, cognition, neurology and psychiatry (AVIESAN), representing psychiatry and sits in several international advisory boards (Neuron ERA NET Cofund, Bipolar Roadmap Initiative, executive committee of ECNP, Director of ECNP Immuno-Psychiatry network).

After studying medicine at the University of Paris-Descartes, she completed her research training at the genetic laboratory of Professor Ken Kidd at Yale University (New Haven, USA) and then completed her thesis in neurosciences in 1990 at the University Pierre et Marie Curie. In 2021, she received the prestigious French award "Grand Prix de la Recherche Inserm" (https://presse.inserm.fr/en/inserm-2021-prizes-science-more-mobilized-than-ever-to-serve-health/44300/).
